He was educated by the aid of a noble patron, first at Pforta and later at Jena. In 1791 he made the acquaintance of Kant, to whose notice he had been favorably introduced by a philosophical essay. He became professor at Jena in 1799. An unfortunate dispute arose, during this latter year, as to the interpretation of certain utterances of Fichte, and an accusation of atheism was made against him. Instead of meeting the charge with disproof, he tried to force the Government to recede from its position. The matter ended with Fichte s dismissal in disgrace, and he went to Berlin. Here he made the acquaintance of the leaders of thought in that city, including Friedrich Schlegel and Schleiermacher, and devoted himself to public...
